1. Where does the author find himself praising the Lord wholeheartedly? How might one person praising in this manner positively affect others?

2. Consider verse 2. What are some of the mighty works of the Lord displayed throughout the Old Testament? How might these things cause us to praise and worship Him even today (even in the midst of trials/sufferings/uncertainty)?

3. Consider the second half of verse 2. What does this insinuate with regards to the discipline of Bible reading in the life of Christ-followers today?

4. In light of verse 2b, what might you say to someone who says that doctrine and theology really aren't that important? In what ways does doctrine and theology impact the way we worship the Lord?

5. What two attributes of God are mentioned in verse 4? How might remembering these two particular attributes of God cause us to join the author in saying, "Praise the Lord!"

6. What are some of the works of God's hands in the New Testament that might serve as motivators for us to give thanks to the Lord with our whole hearts?

7. How many times is the word forever used in Psalm 111? What encouragement does this word offer to us today as believers?

8. For the purpose of giving thanks to the Lord more consistently, how can we make a habit of remembering the works of the Lord in our lives individually? Corporately? What particular disciplines might assist us in this process?

9. Read Psalm 78:6-8. What impact might remembering the works of the Lord have on future generations? How can we take this responsibility more seriously starting today?
