- 1. What were some of the characteristics of those who are in "darkness" (see Rom 13:11-12; Eph 4:17-19; Tit 3:3; 1 Thess 5:6-7)
- 2. What characterizes those who are light in the Lord (see 5:9)?
- 3. What does 5:8 mean when it says you *are* light *in* the Lord?
- 4. What does 5:10 teach us regarding our effort as children of light?
- 5. What does 5:10 say should be the constant behavior and trajectory of those who walk in the light?
- 6. Why is it not enough to obey 5:11 and ignore 5:10?
- 7. What will happen when Christians are faithful to understand God's will, obey it, and take no part in the deeds of darkness?

Application Questions

- 1. Why is it important to not try and find a happy medium, and just be comfortable in our Christian lives as time passes?
- 2. How can we encourage others to avoid the myth of neutrality, and actively seek to know God through His Word, and walk as children of the Light?
- 3. How can we pray for SNCCC in light of what this passage teaches? (see Luke 13:24; John 12:35-36; 1 Peter 2:9-12; 1 John 1:5-7)
