 - a. What is the main command given in 5:15?
 - b. What action does Paul repeat in 4:1, 4:17, 5:1, and 5:15 that help us structure Ephesians 4-6?
 - c. What does Paul pray for in Eph 3:14-19 that helps us fulfill those commands?
- 2. Thankfulness is the expressions of the Spirit-filled life in 4:20.
 - a. What else does the Bible teach about thankfulness? (see Col 2:7; 3:15-17; 4:2; 1 Thess 5:18; Phil 4:6)
 - b. How often, and for how many things, are we to be thankful?
 - c. How can we be thankful even for the difficult circumstances in our lives?
- 3. The other expression of the Spirit-filled life is submitting to one another.
 - a. What does it mean to submit to one another? (see Phil 2:1-5; Mk 10:42-45) Does
 - b. Does God give any parameters on our submission to one another, or are we required to submit to each other equally? (see 5:22-6:9; 1 Pet 2:13; 5:5; Rom 13:1-5; 1 Tim 2:11-12)
 - c. Why is the attitude of humility and submission so difficult for Christians, and misunderstood by the world?
- 4. Submitting to one another is an expression of our ultimate submission to a higher authority.
 - a. What does 5:21 say ought to motivate our submission?
 - b. What does this mean?
 - c. Why is it so essential for Christians to grasp this, and how can we encourage others to yield themselves to it?
- 5. Thankfulness for everything and submission to one another out of reverence for Christ are fundamental attitudes.
 - a. How can we cultivate greater thankfulness in our hearts?
 - b. What keeps us from obeying the command to submit to one another, and how do we grow in that area?
 - c. How will this message help you pray for yourself and SNCCC?
