

### Study Questions

1. Satan has been active from the beginning to oppose God and His purposes.
  - a. What are some of the ways Satan has been active in the OT? (see Gen 3:1-7; Job 1-2; 1 Chron 21:1; 1 Kings 22. It may be helpful to discover some others, also)
  
  - b. What are some ways Satan has been active in the NT? (see Matt 4:1-11; Luke 13:16; 22:3, 31; Acts 5:3; 1 Thess 2:18; 2 Cor 12:7; Rev 13:2, 4; 16:13-14)
  
  - c. What patterns can you find in Satan's activity in the Bible?
  
2. Satan is powerful, but his power is not absolute.
  - a. In what two ways is Satan's power limited (answer was in the sermon)?
  
  - b. Why is it important for believers to understand the vast difference between God and Satan?
  
  - c. How can a firm grasp of God's sovereignty protect Christians from anxiety or despair?
  
  - d. How should Christians think through the issue of God's sovereignty and Satan's activity?
  
3. Satan is a master strategist and tactician with the resources of the world at his disposal to disrupt God's purposes through the church in the world.
  - a. What are some of Satan's strategies and tactics?
  
  - b. What was the main strategy or tactic Satan employed in the garden of Eden?
