The Benediction of Ephesians Ephesians 6:21-24 Study Questions

- 1. The last four verses of Ephesians include some personal words about the people that ministered to Paul, as well as a final prayer and benediction for the Ephesian believers.
 - a. What can believers 2000 years removed from when this letter was written learn from 6:21-24?
 - b. Why did Paul send Tychicus?
 - c. How are 6:23-24 connected to Ephesians 1:2?
- 2. In 6:21, Paul describes Tychicus as a "Faithful brother and beloved servant." Colossians 4:7 adds "fellow slave."
 - a. What does this tell us about Tychicus' character and willingness to serve and support his leaders?
 - b. What does 6:21 tell us about the relationships Paul had with the church in Ephesus (see also Acts 20:17-38)?
 - c. How can the faithful example of Tychicus encourage those who may feel as if their ministry seems mundane or not exciting?
- 3. In the benediction, Paul asks that they receive *peace, love, and grace*. These words are more than a polite statement you add to the end of a letter, they are paced with meaning and genuine desire.
 - a. If Christians already possess peace from God, in what sense does Paul mean?
 - b. What can we learn about "love with faith" from Paul's prayers in the letter, and why would this be included in his final words?
 - c. What experience of grace does Paul desire for those who love Christ?
