 - c. Of what does the resurrection assure us, according to Acts 17:31?
- 2. The resurrection gives us freedom from our past sins.
 - a. According to Romans 3:23, what happens to all who sin?
 - b. Is it possible for a person to be saved only by Jesus' death?
 - c. Define Justification.
 - d. How would you explain how the resurrection relates to our Justification and deliverance from death?
- 3. The resurrection of Jesus Christ gives us power in our present life (see Romans 6:1-14).
 a. Why is it important to understand that our *justification* and our *sanctification* are inseparable?
 - b. How can we maintain this truth and avoid charges of legalism or adding works to the free offer of the gospel?
 - c. How does Romans 6:1-14 encourage us to look to Christ and the power of the resurrection and not our own strength to live a godly life?
 - d. How does the resurrection help you live your current life?
- 4. The resurrection gives us a glorious hope for the future (see 1 Peter 1:3-12).
 - a. Why does Peter remind them of this hope? (see 1:6)
 - b. Why is it difficult for many Christians in our culture to lose sight of this hope?
 - c. How can we keep this hope at the forefront of our minds?
