## The Romans Letter

Romans 12:1-2, 13:11-14

## The Background

The Romans Letter is divided between the <u>Gospel truths</u> and the <u>Gospel's expectations</u> for those who embrace it.

- ⇒ Chaps 1—11 = Gospel truths: What does it mean to believe the gospel?
- ⇒ Chaps 12—15 = Gospel expectations: How does the gospel effect the life of the believer?
  - Chaps 12—13 = Detailed expectations of our new life in Christ (rooted in 6:11—14)
  - Chaps 14—15 = A specific expectation for the local body of Christ (rooted in 11:17-24)

The contextual movement:  $12:1-2 \longrightarrow 15:5-6$ 

## A Closer Look at Chaps 12—13: Detailed expectations

- A. Chaps 12—13 is a unit of thought with bookends
  - 12:1—2 = The time: "in this age"
    - *The action:* presenting your *bodies* and renewing your *minds*
  - 13:11—14 = **The time:** "it is already the hour"
    - The action: "putting on Jesus" and "giving no <u>thought</u> (mind) to the lusts (desires) of the <u>flesh"</u>
- B. The six "detailed expectations" of our new life
  - 1. 12:1-2 Bodies for worship and mind for God's will
  - 2. 12:3-8 Ministering to "the Body" in humility
  - 3. 12:9-21 Love without hypocrisy
  - 4. 13:1-7 Model citizens of the state
  - 5. 13:8-10 Pattern of a good neighbor
  - 6. 13:11-14 Behaving as if you are in the Day (v. 13)
